Filming Agreement

Reference:

Commercial: Images that ultimately result in profit-making – such as digital or film

recording of a visual image or sound recording by a person, business, or other entity

for a market audience, such as for a documentary, television or feature film,

advertisement, or similar project.

Non-commercial: Images that are for personal, recreational, or scholastic purposes – this would include

Toucan Rescue Ranch Filming Description:

The Toucan Rescue Ranch's (TRR) mission is to rescue, rehabilitate, and release Costa Rican wildlife. TRR works with a model that focuses on conservation, education, and research to ensure a brighter tomorrow for native animals. The Toucan Rescue Ranch receives and cares for confiscated, sick, and injured animals from a governing agency called the Ministry of Environment and Energy of Costa Rica (MINAE), who rescues wildlife and brings them to our facility. TRR provides sanctuary while giving premier medical treatment, rehabilitation, and eventual release into its natural environment.

As a wildlife rescue facility, our priority are the animals under our care. It is important that we are **portrayed as a rescue facility and not a zoo or tourist attraction.** We have the following policies, requirements, and restrictions for filming at the Toucan Rescue Ranch.

NOTE: All images made for personal enjoyment (non-commercial) are not bonded to this agreement and can join an Educational Walk. For visitors that photograph/film from visitor viewing areas and during Educational Walks. While shooting, consideration must be given to other visitors, so the view of the animals and enclosures are not obstructed. Students who are using the Toucan Rescue Ranch for a school assignment will need to contact the TRR Marketing Department to discuss whether staff assistance is required. These requests will be considered on a case-by-For scholastic purposes such as projects and assignments, please contact socialmedia@toucanrescueranch.org for approval and scheduling.

Policies & Requirements:		
	Fees are charged with a half-day minimum and must be completed via PayPal. Please review the TRR Filming	
	Agreement Prices & Contract for fee breakdown.	
	Fees must be paid in full before the production takes place.	
	Fees are nonrefundable unless production is cancelled 48-hours in advance. An email notice is required within	
	this timeframe.	
	A completed application, signed by an authorized representative of the organization requesting permission to	
	photograph, submit ten (10) business days prior to the scheduled production.	
	A copy of the script, storyboard, deck, layouts, comps, etc., must be submitted along with the application for	
	TRR to review.	
	The Toucan Rescue Ranch does not allow photography that is intended to be placed with stock photography	
	agencies (e.g. Getty Images) or that is offered for sale on personal websites.	
	Any airing or posting of photographs, video, or other media made during the filming agreement must give	
	reference to the Toucan Rescue Ranch, as well as, provide TRR's website when possible.	
	All special equipment must be approved by TRR's Co-Founder, Leslie Howle, before use such as props, drones,	
	special lighting, etc. – please indicate this in the TRR Filming Agreement Prices & Contract.	
	Any damage or loss to plants, property, or animals which occurs during the filming/photography production	
	will be assessed and charged back to the party responsible for requesting use of the Toucan Rescue Ranch.	
	Production and the lead contact agree to provide the Toucan Rescue Ranch with a valid certificate of liability	
	insurance.	
	An authorized TRR staff/intern must always accompany photography/film crews while production is	
	underway. If violation of this policy takes place, the Toucan Rescue Ranch, at its sole discretion, may terminate	
	any on-grounds production at any time. The applicant agrees to abide by this decision should such occur.	
	The Toucan Rescue Ranch is not liable or responsible for the loss or damage of production equipment.	
	The Toucan Rescue Ranch has the right to host and use the edited or completed content on TRR channels.	
	Notifying Toucan Rescue Ranch of an estimated timeframe of when content will be published is encouraged.	
Filming Restrictions:		
	Co-Founder, Leslie Howle, will have the final approval on which animals are eligible for filming.	
	Director of photography, hosts, production, filming crew, and any additional assistants are not permitted to	
	touch any of the animals.	
	Entering the enclosures or animal care areas is prohibited. All filming/photography must take place within	
	areas designated for public use and shall not restrict the Educational Walk's access or viewing of animals or	
	enclosures.	
	Filming will be done on the outdoor property. Special permission must be granted to film inside any of TRR's	
	facilities including clinics, housing, kitchens, enclosures, or other facilities. Please be sure to request this in the	
	TRR Filming Agreement Prices & Contract.	
	No hands or equipment on/in any enclosures unless guided by authorized TRR staff.	
	Normal hours of operation are 7:00am to 4:00pm. Closed Sundays. However, if filming is outside of normal	
	hours, approval required, additional fees will apply.	
	Weather conditions, enclosure changes, or unexpected animal occurrences may cause delay or cancellation of	
	a scheduled production. The Toucan Rescue Ranch will attempt to reschedule in a timely manner.	

	Extreme noise, lighting (such as flash), or special effects may create stress or harm to the animals. Anything
	deemed dangerous to the Toucan Rescue Ranch, its enclosures, or animals will not be allowed. Permission will be required if filming/photography includes unusual production techniques or flash.
	Bright colors can stress animals. It is best to wear earth toned clothes during your visit. Refrain from scented lotions and perfumes. We highly recommend water resistant gear during your visit.
	Any photography/film/video taken at the Toucan Rescue Ranch must not be used in any manner that could negatively impact or influence the public's impression of the rescue center and its programs. Furthermore there will be no implied or actual endorsement of a product, idea or institution. Any misrepresentation will be considered grounds for legal action. The applicant agrees to indemnify the Toucan Rescue Ranch, including its staff, volunteers, and visitors against all liability and loss which may occur as a result of accident, negligence, or inadvertent damage or injury to the person or property of the party entering into this agreement.
	No animals can be used as a prop in photo/video to promote a concept or product.
*Exce	eptions to this policy must be submitted in writing and approved (10) ten business days prior to visit.
